PE Sports Funding (Academic Year 2016—2017)

Targets:

To widen the range of physical activities the children are participating in.

To build upon the strengths of the current PE curriculum through enrichment and enjoyment.

To further engage children in a wide range of physical activities and opportunities.

Situation / Critical Analysis

Most schools with primary-age pupils receive the PE and sport premium in the academic year 2016 to 2017. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

Desired Outcome

To develop or add to the PE and sport activities that school already offers

To make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

What we have done this year

Climbing sessions at Lancaster University

BMC indoor climbing award scheme

Dance sessions provided by Ludus Dance

Increase Outdoor and Adventurous Activities curriculum

including regular visits to Borwick Hall

(Indoor caving, indoor climbing, orienteering, canoeing, team building challenges)

Participation in events organised by local sports partnership

British Orienteering Explorer challenge

World Orienteering Day 2017

Established a short orienteering course

Staff training - curriculum updates

Introduction of 'Daily Mile'

Next Steps

To introduce new sports/activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport

To support and involve the least active children by running or extending additional end of day options

To join with/run sports activities with other schools
