A large focus of our curriculum and teaching at school is on self control, emotional regulation and managing feelings, responses etc. The children are taught in weekly sessions about all of the above and strategies to manage themselves in a positive way. We encourage children to use the strategies taught to deal with situations that they may find tricky. Each class have a weekly Zones of Regulation lesson, Personal, Social, Health and Emotional education lesson, relaxation session and access values education lessons throughout the week. They also learn about their brain and how the brain is responding in different situations in order for them to make positive choices and have self control.

DAMAGE TO SCHOOL AND STAFF PROPERTY

During the Summer and Autumn term we have had an increase in deliberate damage to school and staff property from children. We have dealt with a lot of this through the school behaviour policy and practice. E.g. children receiving loss of bonus points for damage. However, several areas of the school were significantly damaged including the new class bases and new sensory rooms. We understand that when children are feeling upset, frustrated and cross they may feel the need to lash out, however it is not acceptable to hurt, damage and destroy. The curriculum and support in place are all positive and preventative. There are lots of strategies and support mechanisms in place for all children at all parts of the school day.

One of our core values is Respect and we teach the children about this constantly.

We are therefore going to enforce the following actions.

If your child deliberately causes damage to school or another person's property we will do the following

Incident 1—Letter Home to parent / carer for you to discuss your child's actions with them at home. Reminding you and your child that if a further incident takes place there will be a letter asking for you to pay the cost of repair / replacement.

Incident 2—Letter home to parent / carer which will include the request for payment for repair / replacement of damage.

Any further incidents—further contributions / full costs will be asked for and a meeting will be held with parent / carer and child regarding behaviour.



ClassDojo

We use Class Dojo app across the school. All the teachers use the app to share success, share work and our children's achievements. Parents can download the app and see their child's profile as well as whole school news.
