Operation Encompass	Our school is part of Operation Encompass which works in conjunction between schools and Lancashire Constabulary.
SPERATION ENCOMPASS	Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced any domestic abuse, or where the police have attended a home for different reasons and children from our school are present.
In every force. In every school. For every child.	We have three Designated Safeguarding Leads – Alison Dodd, Micaela Armstrong and Jane Meacham. The DSL's receive information from other agencies such as the Police in order to ensure children have the best support in place following any incidents.
	We continue to ask parents / carers to inform school of any incidents, changes etc. that may cause your child distress and impact on their school day.
Packed Lunches   Image: Constraint of the second se	We are working hard on the school dinner menu to ensure it is balanced and has healthy elements.
	If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please can you ensure it is a balanced healthy lunch too.

Behaviour Update	The vast majority of children are settled in school and are making positive choices with their behaviour.
Hitting	However, we have had a few children who have recently displayed very dangerous behaviour towards staff. E.g. Hurting, spitting, biting.
	This is taken very seriously and it is expected that the child reflects on their behaviour and repairs with the adults. If this behaviour continues parents/ carers will be asked to come to school for a meeting to discuss their child's behavioural responses.
	Whilst we are a school that understands and supports children with challenging and complex behaviour it is not acceptable for staff to be getting hurt and we would appreciate that this is followed up at home.
Y6-Y7	For all our Y6 parents we recommend you still make an application for a mainstream school. Whilst this may be a formality for some we have been in the situation where children in Y6 have not been allocated a school because applications were not submitted.
YEAR 6 INTO YEAR 7	We have a new SENDO who is now called a case manager for all the children with Education Health Care Plans. His name is Paul Robinson and we will be inviting him to all of our EHC reviews.
	Our main priority this half term is to ensure we have completed all the annual reviews for Y6 children so we can make appropriate recommendations around the support and provision your child will require at Y7.
	If you have any queries please contact Micaela Armstrong who will be able to support you through the process.
