Welcome back to the new Autumn term.

Values at Stepping Stones

The Values of the week are RESPECT and TRUST.

This first week back, our focused values will be **respect and trust – two of our core school values** - and we will be teaching the children and showing the children what these mean, daily.

This week we will be focussing on how each of us has a responsibility to help each other - to settle back into routines; find our way about; establish the school rules; respect our school environment; and in particular how 'easy' it can be to say something unkind and disrespectful, but impossible to take back, once it has been said. By learning and understanding about the importance of respect in our world, we gradually build up **trust** in those people we live with; and play and work alongside each day.

Please do take the time to discuss this with your child at home – ask them about the "Ketchup squirt" - and do let us know when they have been able to show respect to others around them at home. We love to be able to celebrate home nominations for our Values' Board in school each week. Simply message the class teacher via Class Dojo for a home nomination which will be read out and celebrated at Daily Meeting.



Can-do Colin will be resuming his weekends at home with the children. Please do encourage your child to involve him in your weekend activities and to pop a photo/picture/sentence in the diary ready for his return to school each Monday.

Class Dojo	Our main form of communication with home is via Class Dojo. This is a free app where you can link to the school.
	We share learning, newsletters, positive experiences and communicate key messages through this system.
	Please ensure you are signed up. New sign in details can be sent home to parents who are not on the APP.
School Lunches	All our meals are prepared by our Housekeeper; Mrs Houghton. She works very hard to tempt the children to try new foods, to help ensure they have a healthy plate of food with lots of vegetables, salad and fruit.
	If a child really does not like anything on the daily menu, they will always be offered a sandwich, wrap or alternative simple option, however we will be continuing to encourage all of the children to try something new; do help your child, if needed, to look at the menu each week; and to discuss new foods they may like to try. The menu is published weekly on class dojo. A Reminder: though we do of course try at all costs to keep the price of meals to a minimum, as you are all aware, the cost of certain food items is continually increasing and we will unfortunately be increasing the cost of school meals to £2.50 this term. 	Please can you encourage and praise your child at home for working hard. Our school is focused on building positive relationships with the children to provide safety, consistency and trust. We have a firm, fair, friendly and focused approach. All staff have the same expectations so children know boundaries.
	Over the next 2 weeks we will be completing Emotional Regulation Plans with each child and talking to them about what helps them remain calm and in a good place for learning. Once these are complete, we will be sending a copy home for you to see what strategies and support have been agreed.
School Uniform	Finally, a reminder about our expectations around the school uniform: On return for our Autumn Term , do please ensure your child is in the correct uniform for school, thank you:
	 Our school uniform is navy blue jumper / cardigan. White polo / shirt/ t shirt. Dark grey or black trousers/ leggings, skirt / shorts or jogging bottoms. NO LOGOS. Children should be wearing black school shoes or plain black trainers. Again, no logos. Children who are with us for short periods of time may choose to wear their mainstream school uniform.
	 We do have uniform available to purchase if you wish your child to have a jumper with a logo / t shirt with a logo.
	Only on PE days children may wear their PE kit. Again, this should be plain non-branded joggers / shorts and plain PE T- shirts (White, blue, black). NO FOOTBALL shirts or hoodies. They can wear their navy jumper over the top.
