




## The Value of the week is Caring.

Evie proudly shared some descriptive writing about a setting from the story the class are studying in English. She was happy to explain to everyone herself! Fabulous Evie! 😊


Jayden was happy to share and discuss his learning where he had been finding the common denominator to add and subtract fractions. Very well done Jayden!

### **Attendance and Booking Holidays during Term Time**

Attendance matters! School has been looking at the attendance data for the Autumn Term; it has been noticed that there are a few key children with growing absences. This will be closely monitored over the coming weeks; and we will be in touch with further information to support if required. For our children to gain the greatest benefit from their education, it is vital that they attend regularly and every child should be in school every day the school is open unless they have an unavoidable reason to be absent. Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning. "Government research shows a direct link between attendance and attainment and good attenders also make better progress socially, learn to work with others, and are better prepared for the transition to secondary school and, eventually, higher education, training and employment".

If you are booking holidays during term time, please be mindful that these will not be authorised unless in exceptional circumstances. Any child on a dual placement e.g. still on roll at mainstream school should have the holiday request authorised by their mainstream school.
