Values at Stepping Stones



The Values of the Week are TOLERANCE AND KINDNESS



Our focused values this week will be **tolerance** and **kindness**. They are two of our core school values and we will be discussing what these can both look and feel like to each of us, daily.

During our Circle Time, we will be focussing particularly on kindness and the children's task in school this week is taken from the book by Carol McCloud "Have you Filled a Bucket today?"

The idea is that everyone carries around an invisible bucket throughout the day, which is being filled by the kind things that you do for others or that others do for you. A bucket filler is someone who is showing positive character traits (kindness, compassion care, respect, consideration for others), and is being a responsible citizen. When our buckets are full, we feel happy. When our buckets are empty, we feel sad.

The children will each have a bucket to fill with kindness! We can't wait to see the children start practising being bucket fillers in the classroom, and of course do continue to encourage the children to be bucket fillers at home!

Please do take some time to discuss these values with your child at home and let us know when they have been able to show tolerance and kindness within the family; or when they have worked well as a team with either yourselves or their brothers and sisters. We love to be able to celebrate home nominations for our Values' Board in school each week.

Can-do Colin will be resuming his weekends at home with the children. Please do encourage your child to involve him in your weekend activities and to pop photo/picture/ sentence in the diary ready for his return to school each Monday. Thank you.

Operation Encompass Our school is part of Operation Encompass which works in conjunction between schools and Lancashire Constabulary.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced any domestic abuse, or where the police have attended a home for different reasons and children from our school are present.

We have four Designated Safeguarding Leads for the next 2 terms – Ms Hamer, Miss Meacham, Miss Hunter and Mrs Armstrong. The DSL's receive information from other agencies such as the Police in order to ensure children have the best support in place following any incidents.

We continue to ask parents / carers to inform school of any incidents, changes etc. that may cause your child distress and impact on their school day.

School Uniform – just as children do in mainstream schools, all our children at Stepping Stones are also expected to wear our school uniform please.



Our school uniform is navy blue jumper / cardigan. White polo / shirt/ t shirt.

Grey or black trousers/ leggings, skirt / shorts or jogging bottoms.

Children should be wearing black school shoes or black trainers.

Children who are with us for short periods of time may choose to wear their mainstream school uniform.

We do have uniform available to purchase if you wish your child to have a jumper with a logo / t shirt with a

logo.

On PE days children may wear their PE kit. Again, this should be plain **non-branded** joggers / shorts and **plain PE T-shirts** (White, blue, black). NO FOOTBALL shirts or hoodies. They can wear their navy jumper over the top.

Please read the class newsletter / information on Class Dojo to find your child's PE day.

Thank you for your continued support. The children continue to build positive relationships in class teams; and are busy making our new pupils feel welcome! Thank you so much for mirroring our school ethos and school values at home.
