year, Unity. We will be discussing what this can both look and feel like to


each of us, daily.

Operation Encompass Our school is part of Operation Encompass which works in conjunction between schools and Lancashire Constabulary.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced any domestic abuse, or where the police have attended a home for different reasons and children from our school are present.

We have four Designated Safeguarding Leads for the next 2 terms – Ms Hamer, Miss Meacham, Miss Hunter and Mrs Armstrong. The DSL's receive information from other agencies such as the Police in order to ensure children have the best support in place following any incidents.

We continue to ask parents / carers to inform school of any incidents, changes etc. that may cause your child distress and impact on their school day.

School Uniform – just as children do in mainstream schools, all our children at Stepping Stones are also expected to wear our school uniform please.



Our school uniform is navy blue jumper / cardigan. White polo / shirt/ t shirt.

Grey or black trousers/ leggings, skirt / shorts or jogging bottoms.

Children should be wearing black school shoes or black trainers.

Children who are with us for short periods of time may choose to wear their mainstream school uniform.

On PE days children may wear their PE kit. Again, this should be plain **non-branded** joggers / shorts and **plain PE T-shirts** (White, blue, black). NO FOOTBALL shirts or hoodies. They can wear their navy jumper over the top.

Things from home A reminder for the new Spring Term:

Your child does not need to bring anything other than a water bottle to school. All equipment is provided.

If it has been agreed for the child to have a comforter e.g. teddy, this needs to be agreed with the class teacher and the teacher will set rules around where this stays during learning times.

We don't encourage children to bring things for the following reasons....

- It causes problems / difficulties and can cause further upset for your child when we have rules about objects.
- It may go missing, lost, misplaced etc.
- It could get damaged.

We encourage children to take responsibility for their bags, clothing etc. It is also really helpful if school jumpers/cardigans are named.

Please do not send your child with objects from home. We cannot accept responsibility for lost or damaged items. Please do not send your child with expensive clothing / objects. Jewelry is not to be worn in school. If a child's ears are pierced then the expectation is for studs only to be worn, for safety reasons. Thank you.

Thank you for your continued support. The children continue to build positive relationships in class teams; and are busy making our new pupils feel welcome! Thank you so much for mirroring our school ethos and school values at home.
