The Value of the Week is Appreciation

This week the value we will be discussing is Appreciation. We will begin the week as usual with our whole school Circle Time.

Research shows that "feeling and expressing gratitude helps people feel more positive emotions, relish good experiences, improve their health, deal with adversity, and build strong relationships."

Feeling appreciation is difficult for children since it seems to develop with maturity.

It's common for us to tell our children, "Say thank you", "Say please", and "Ask me when you want to go to a friend's house rather than telling me." We are sure you have many more directions that you give your children to mould them into being appreciative children. What often gets forgotten, however, is that children learn about appreciation by how we, as adults, treat them more than by how we tell them to treat others. Our behavior shows our children how much we value them.

As parents/teachers, it's easy to get drawn into what the children aren't doing or how they are acting that we're not happy about. This focus can put a drain on a relationship. Instead, at Stepping Stones/at home, it is important that we put specific energy into showing the children that they add value and meaning to our school/family life.

We will be teaching the children and helping them to understand that Appreciation is the recognition and enjoyment of the good qualities of someone or something. At school this week the staff will be showing their appreciation for all the children's hard work and effort; their positive mindset and determination, by having a celebration day on Thursday, as we prepare for the Easter Break!

The children will be practicing this in their classes this week and discussing in their classes what Appreciation can both look and feel like to each of us, daily.

Remember we love to hear about how the children are showing and sharing our school values at home! Look out for examples when your child has shown appreciation within the family! Then simply message the class teacher via Class Dojo for a home nomination, which will be read out and celebrated at Daily Meeting.

Finally, Can-do Colin was out and about over the weekend and we can't wait to hear about all of his adventures – please do remember to send in some photos of his exploits with your child on Class Dojo. Thank you, we really do value your input from home.
