Class Dojo

Our main way of communication is Class Dojo. Please ensure you are signed up to this App so that you do not miss any key reminders or information regarding your child's school day and events. It is upsetting for the children if they are not prepared for any changes or events when they get to school.

Also make sure that all phone numbers and key contacts are up to date. In case of an emergency, we must have up to date numbers. It is important that you return any missed calls as soon as possible please, as we may be ringing about a poorly child; an emergency situation; as well of course as the importance of good communication between home and school in support of your child's needs.

Parents/Carers can also ring the school office from 8:00am if required.

Any money coming into school e.g. dinners, trips, should be in a named envelope please.

Medication should always be handed to the Passenger Assistant in a named envelope also. Thank you.

At Stepping Stones we do like to ensure the children have access to a range of experiences outside of

their normal school day. Of course such trips out do require for the Local Authority a risk assessment to be completed. This looks at the venue, its facilities, staffing, appropriateness of activities etc and of course that the children are safe and kept safe.




Forthcoming school trips

Risk assessments are completed thoroughly and with every availble staff where required. However, if in the weeks leading up to such a trip and your child is putting others at risk in school, then unfortunately, we would deem the risk is too high to take your child off site.

PE KIT

For our new parents/carers: Only on PE days children may wear their PE kit.

This should be **plain non-branded** joggers / shorts and **plain PE T- shirts, muted colours please** (White, blue, black, grey); OR for our children on 12 week placements with us, the **PE kit** they wear for their mainstream school. **NO FOOTBALL** shirts or **hoodies.** They can wear their navy jumper over the top.

For all our parents/carers: A BIG Thank you for all of your recent support with ensuring your child arrives for PE in the correct kit. There has been a noticeable difference in the children now arriving in the correct wear. Thank you so much for all of your support and co-operation – it is very much appreciated, especially as it

is avoiding unnecessary confrontation on PE days.





Attendance and Booking Holidays during Term Time

Attendance matters!





School has been looking at the attendance data for the Spring and Summer Terms; it has been noticed that there are a few key children with growing absences. This will be closely monitored over the coming weeks; and we will be in touch with further information to support if required. For our children to gain the greatest benefit from their education, it is vital that they attend regularly and every child should be in school every day the school is open unless they have an unavoidable reason to be absent. Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning. "Government research shows a direct link between attendance and attainment and good attenders also make better progress socially, learn to work with others, and are better prepared for the transition to secondary school and, eventually, higher education, training and employment".

If you are booking holidays during term time, please be mindful that these will not be authorised unless in exceptional circumstances.

Any child on a dual placement e.g. still on roll at mainstream school should have the holiday request authorised by their mainstream school; as well as informing ourselves please.



Finally, a BIG Thank You to everyone continuing to work hard at home to read with your child each evening and to sign and return your child's reading folder promptly.

Do speak to your class teacher if you would like any help with this e.g. organising a routine; remembering the book bag each day - we understand how busy mornings at home can be!



The chidlren are enjoying choosing their home readers and continue to focus very well in school to both make good progress and to develop a "love of reading for life"!
